

Cross Gills Beat

A three quarter mile beat, on the right bank of the “Big Ribble”, owned by the Society consisting of a stretch of broken water followed by a run in to the long pool. The run itself provides challenging wading but can be very productive at the right height. The long pool is effectively split into two pools by a rock ledge running across the river and comprises some really deep water with fish being found across its width. The tail of the long pool flows into shallower broken water with a few deeper gullies where fish rest when running.

At the top end of the beat it is connected to the Jumbles – Calder Foot Beat (part of the Stonyhurst Estate waters). At the lower end of the beat, just past the aqueduct it connects to the Trough House Beat also owned by the Society.
